## **Conflict Minerals Policy**

Greenliant is committed to using conflict-free minerals, and supports the Responsible Business Alliance (RBA) and Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI) efforts to address responsible sourcing through the development of the Responsible Mineral Initiative's flagship Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP). The RMAP aims to enable companies to source conflict-free minerals.

Specifically, "conflict minerals" refer to tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold from mines and smelters that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and its surrounding countries (Conflict Region).

While the electronics industry supply chain is complex and it can be difficult to trace the origin of all minerals and metals, Greenliant is surveying its suppliers via the RMAP Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) to ensure responsible sourcing of conflict-free minerals in our supply chain.

As Greenliant conducts its own due diligence, it expects its suppliers to establish their own programs to ensure conflict-free supply chains. Using the RBA and GeSI RMAP Compliant Smelter Lists, companies will be assured that the processed minerals and metals originated from conflict-free sources.
