EU REACH Directive Statement

The European Union's REACH directive 1999/45/ED and Regulation (EC) Number 1907/2006 regulate the importation into the European Community of "Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC)" for the purpose manufacturing articles. REACH entered into force on June 1st, 2007, with the aim of replacing previous legislation and harmonizing with remaining European Union legislation enacted to protect human health and the environment.

Greenliant products are not intended to and do not release SVHCs during normal or reasonably foreseeable conditions of use and operation. Therefore, Greenliant is not registering SVHC compounds at this time.

To further ensure compliance, Greenliant has confirmed with our supply chain manufacturing partners that Greenliant NANDrive, Specialty Flash Memory, NAND Controllers, ArmourDrive (PX series), Enterprise SSD (G31 PX series) products and packaging comply with REACH and do not contain SVHC substances published in the January 2023 candidate list (233 substances) on the ECHA website above the 0.1% wt/wt threshold. All products do not contain any substances under the condition of restriction in Annex XVII.

Greenliant will monitor Annex XIV, Annex XVII and the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern for Authorization. As updates to the SVHC list are published, Greenliant will verify with our manufacturing partners that Greenliant devices do not contain SVHCs above a concentration level of 0.1% w/w (weight by weight). Greenliant will also ensure SVHCs are not present in articles in quantities over one ton per year.
